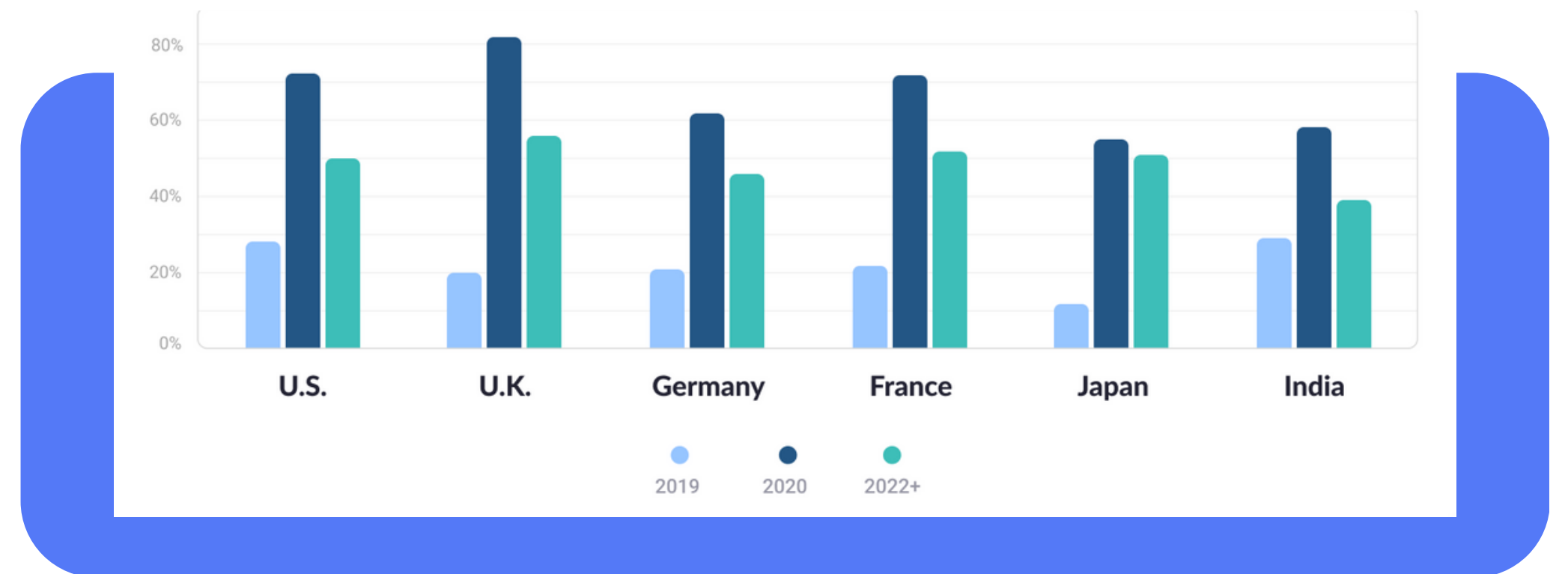

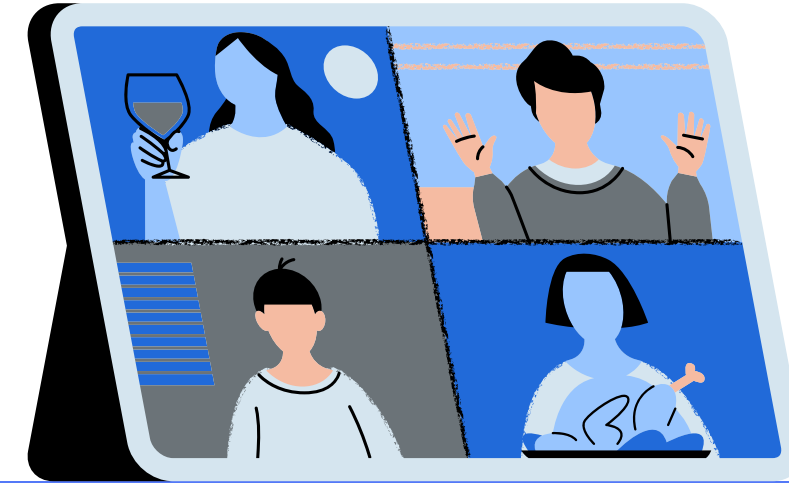
What is zoom?

Education

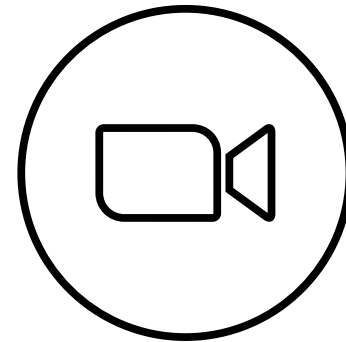
Online classes, lectures, seminars, and tutorials.
